Course Requirements

UNIV 1810: Learning Community Seminar (1 credit). This course will help you get acquainted with the university and introduce you to the topic of your Learning Community. (Required for all LC Members.)

UNIV 1840: Learning Community Service-Learning (1 credit). This course focuses on activities, discussions, and reflections related to community service and experiential learning activities.

ENGL 1007: Seminar in Writing and Multimodal Composition (4 credits). You can complete this first-year writing general education requirement with your fellow Learning Community students.

PHIL 1104: Philosophy and Social Ethics (3 credits). Complete this introductory course with your fellow Learning Community Students.

HRTS 1007: Introduction to Human Rights (3 credits). This course explores central human rights institutions, selected human rights themes and political controversies, and key political challenges of contemporary human rights advocacy.
